



MassWildlife Lands User Guide

Facing Rock Wildlife Management Area

Towns: Granby, Ludlow
Acreage: 1,365
Wildlife Management Zone: 7

Description of property:

Facing Rock WMA is part of a complex of lands with public access easements that total more than 3,000 acres. The rolling terrain is predominately upland central hardwood forest of oak, hickory, and white pine with a few beaver wetlands along the western side of the property.

Location/Access/Parking:

Parking for 3 vehicles is available at a town-owned, unmaintained dirt parking area off of Bridle Road. Access to this property can be gained from Carver Street or from Facing Rock WCE and Ludlow Reservoir WCE.

Hunting Opportunities:

Opportunities to pursue white-tailed deer, black bear, wild turkey, and gray squirrel are present on this property.

Fishing Opportunities:

Facing Rock WMA contains headwater sections of several streams which, due to their small size, provide limited fishing opportunities. Higher Brook is a coldwater fisheries resource which flows through the southern portion of the property.

Wildlife Viewing and Other Features:

This WMA provides quality habitat for species requiring large areas of unfragmented forest. Two major transmission lines bisect the property which allows opportunities to spot wildlife along the wooded edges.
